What do Ira and Gladys West and George Washington have in common? They all have extraordinary life stories that have played a role in the collegiate studies of the Dahlgren Heritage Museum's 2022 college interns. (More on that later.)

As we bid farewell to Jenn Glazebrook, who graduated this month from the University of Mary Washington, and also welcome our two new interns —Gillian Both, a 2022 UMW graduate, and Niamh Connell, a rising junior at St. Mary's College in Maryland — it's the perfect time to celebrate the contributions our interns have made and continue to make to our museum.

The list of Jenn's accomplishments is lengthy. She put together a plan for an exhibit on the famed Dahlgren "computer bug" (an actual moth found in Dahlgren's first computer in 1947), researched how we could enhance our virtual presence, and developed a marketing video for the museum. But her major task was to create a virtual and physical exhibit honoring Ira and Gladys West, which will debut at the museum in July. The Dahlgren Base Tour is Back!

For the first time in almost three years, the Dahlgren Heritage Museum's tour of the base is back. On May 14, under the expert guidance of tour leader (and museum VP) Rob Gates, two dozen visitors spent 90 minutes seeing everything from the century-old Dahlgren School (now in its third location) to the big guns on the main range overlooking the Potomac.

Check our website and social media outlets for a link to order tickets through Eventbrite.com. Tours are free and include a guided tour of the museum at the end of the ride, but reservations are required.

Stops include the base's Parade Field for an upclose look at the 16-inch/50-caliber gun from the USS New Jersey, last fired in 1991. It was proof tested at Dahlgren in 1942 before being installed on the New Jersey, and was fired 179 times in the South Pacific during World War II.
