

Dahlgren Heritage Foundation Goes on the Road

The State Historical Society of Missouri held its 65th annual Missouri Conference on History in Springfield, Missouri, on March 15-17. I was invited to present my paper "The Navy Comes to Dahlgren...or Does It?" as part of their "Congress & Its Constituents" panel. Now there are at least ten more people in Missouri who have heard of Dahlgren!

Harry Black, one of our docents, invited me to speak at the March 8 luncheon of the Be Active Live Longer (B.A.L.L.) group at Oakland Baptist Church. So, I had the opportunity to dry run my presentation. They got the "unabridged" version of the talk, and I learned an important lesson about time management! Since several former Dahlgren employees attended the meeting, there was a lively interchange.

The presentation at the conference in Missouri was limited to 20 minutes and only addressed the first dozen years of Dahlgren history. The paper on which the presentation is based covers Dahlgren history up to the present and was published in the December 2021 issue of the Northern Neck of Virginia Historical Magazine.


Dahlgren Heritage Museum Teams with the Library of Congress



The exhibit featuring Ira and Dr. Gladys West continues to provide opportunities for the Museum to expand its partnerships. Recent inquiries by the Library of Congress Manuscripts Division


(https://www.loc.gov/rr/mss/mss_abt.html) to the West Family led to a visit in January by Mr. Josh Levy, the Technology Historian for the Library of Congress, Manuscripts Division as reported in last month's Deck Log. On March 3rd, this writer and my granddaughter, Jillian, got to deliver the first box of West material that will be archived at the Library of Congress documenting the extraordinary career of Dr. Gladys West. Josh provided a tour of the Madison Building facility, showing us some of the 70,000,000 items they have in their collections. These items included a lock of Abigail Adams' hair, an original Porgy and Bess director's script signed by George Gershwin and the original cast, a letter from Eleanor Roosevelt to Dr. Oppenheimer asking if UFOs were real, a contract signed by Marie Curie purchasing Radium for \$100,000 and a page from a math cypher document written by Abraham Lincoln. (The way they taught math in Lincoln's time was to show students how to do it in the classroom and, for their final exam, have them turn in a book documenting what they learned called a cypher

book.) 

The tour also included a walk through the vaults where they keep such things as all the writings of the Presidents from George Washington to Calvin Coolidge (the National Archives took this responsibility over for the rest of the Presidents in the 1930s), the writings of American authors such as Walt Whitman, the writings of scientists such as Alexander Graham Bell, and the writings of Supreme Court Justices like Ruth Bader Ginsburg. Dr. West is in good company.

The tour continued into the Jefferson Building and the famous reading room. My voracious book reading granddaughter declared she needed a Library of Congress library card. The Museum will continue to share more of Dr. West's material as the family provides it. It was a trip that the writer and his granddaughter will never forget.
