In 2022, University of Mary Washington Professor Cristina Turdean's Historic Preservation exhibit class produced a set of panels for the museum that covered the base's history and its impact to King George County from 1918 through World War II. These panels are currently on display at King George High School. In 2023, Professor Turdean again agreed to have her exhibit class work with us to develop a set of panels covering the years 1945 through 1974 called "The Dahlgren Way." This time period was one of uncertainty of remaining open and of turbulent transformation of the work performed by the base as well as the workforce performing that work.
